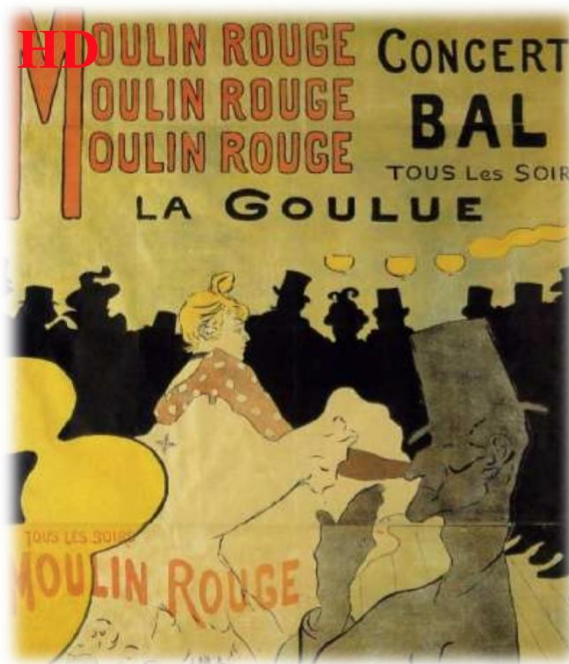

Despite a short life marked by illness, Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec produced numerous works.

He immersed himself in Impressionism and befriended Edgar Degas and Vincent Van Gogh.

Incapable of taking part in the activities of the healthy-bodied, he lived for his art and became a Post-Impressionist painter, an Art Nouveau illustrator and a remarkable lithographer.

A regular at the cabarets, especially the Moulin Rouge, and bordellos of Montmartre he became famous for his numerous portraits of prostitutes and dancers.

As an illustrator, he produced posters that have since become famous, and he also illustrated 40-some songs, mainly hit-songs played at the three major Parisian cabarets of the time: Moulin Rouge, Aristide Bruant's Mirliton and Le Chat Noir.

Toulouse-Lautrec is known as a brilliant artist whose remarkable skill of observation was doubled by a deep sympathy for humanity.
