Throughout the world, French wines are recognised for their exceptional quality, especially the wines of the Bordeaux and Burgundy regions.

Cheval Blanc has its origins in the mid 19th century when Mr. Ducasse decided to create a building. It was bought in 1998 by the chairman of LVMH (Louis Vuitton - Moet Hennessy) Bernard Arnault and Albert Frere Belgian banker.

The Chateau Cheval Blanc was named first Grands Crus A Saint-Emilion in 1955.

It has a character unique to smooth the area nearby Pomerol. The originality of wine is related to its dominant to Cabernet Franc (60% of the blend), which brings the aromatic complexity and balance.

At the Fourth Century AD, the poet Bordeaux Ausonus accumulates earthly riches and honors during his long life. The name of Ausonius is attached since more than four centuries to the property, but nothing yet to assume that this is the villa of the poet.

The Chateau Ausone is one of the top classified growths A Saint-Emilion.

Those who are privileged to taste his wine will find it a freshness and an elegance that persists over time. Under the aegis of owner of the place, Alain Vauthier, vintages are copies since 1995, with a great aromatic complexity and a silky

texture.
