East facing, the Cote de Nuits is one of the most prestigious wine-growing areas in Burgundy, part of the Cote d'Or alongside its counterpart, the Cote de Beaune.

Located both to the north and south of the town Nuits-Saint-Georges, the Cote de Nuits is divided into 16 wine-growing communes.

quality wines, which improve with age. Rich in colour, full-bodied and yet still elegant, the Dugat-Py estate is one of the best in Burgundy.

The Domaine Jérôme Galeyrand on the other hand, is a relatively young estate, with 5 hectares spread over the Côte de Nuits region: Marsannay, Fixin, Gevrey-Chambertin, Chambole Musigny ... Increasingly well known, this estate consistently strives for perfection and quality.

Although the estate has existed for 200 years, the Domaine du Comte Liger-Belair was taken over in 2000 by Viscount Louis-Michel Liger-Belair making it a relatively young player.

The family Liger-Belair bought the Château de Vosne in 1815 and started to expand the estate's wine production.

Made up of 12 appellations spread over various communes: Vosne Romanée, Flagey Echezeaux and Nuits Saint Georges, the Domaine du Comte Liger-Belair is one of the most well respected in Burgundy both for the quality of its wine, and its history.
