

We will be visiting four of the most prestigious Champagne Houses.

The house of ROEDERER, rated second in the Vin de France list of the 50 best Champagnes, has been a family-run business since its foundation in 1819. Furthermore, it is one of the rare Champagne Houses which continues to be independent.

Founded in 1843 by Johann-Joseph KRUG, the Champagne House KRUG was bought in 1999 by the LVMH, the world's foremost luxury goods conglomerate.

The fruit of passionate and patient labour, Krug champagne remains one of the best and most prestigious aperitifs. From selecting the grapes until the barrelling of the wine, The Krug House works arduously and with the greatest care to produce its champagne.

The champagne TAITTINGER, one of the most prestigious wine houses of Champagne, has more than 12 to 13 million bottles currently in stock.

For 200 years, the Taittinger family has strived to create a "champagne d'excellence", respecting the house's trademark, the use of Chardonnay.

The Pol Roger house is a French independent family business, particularly envied by the English. Winston Churchill's favourite "mousseux", the brand has developed its image to become one of the most prestigious champagne houses.

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
