Piedmont is one of Italy's major wine producing regions. This mountainous region of Northern Italy has cascades of vintage wines to be tried.

These wines are made using different varieties of grape, the commonest being the Barbera, the very fine Dolcetto, Nebbiolo (probably the best) and the Moscato for white wine.

Among the red wines, the Barolo and Barbaresco produce some of Italy, and the world's, greatest wines.

Piedmont is a multifaceted region, hosting such ambivalent sceneries as Turin industries and Alpine villages.

This variety is reflected in its wines. Blessed with a broad selection of grape varieties, Piedmont produces wines as exceptional and varied as Barolo and Asti Spumante.

Barolo, Italy's ultimate red wine is known to be the greatest accompaniment to game, truffles and smoked meats. Improving with time, it needs five to six years to mature to its point of excellence.

This film will take you through the secrets to produce Italy's greatest wines.
