The greatness of Château Margaux lies not only in its terroir, but also in its history and the men who have worked to build the reputation of her wines.

The wines are mostly made from cabernet sauvignon, with a dash of petit verdot; they are by nature powerful, yet elegant.

The Château Mouton Rothschild is famous for the quality of its wines, but also for a unique tradition started by the director of the estate, Baron Philippe in 1945: each year they invite a celebrate artist such as Dali, Chagall, Warhol and Miro, to design the label for the bottles.

The owners of these great estates open their doors to us, and introduce us to the people whose hard-work, passion and patience, contribute to the conception of these outstanding wines.
